Discussion Starter – Reflect on a time when you felt overwhelmed by a situation that seemed beyond your ability to handle. How did you respond? How did God respond? What role did your faith play during that time?

Read Daniel 10:10-17

- 1. What is Daniel's position when he is touched by the hand? What is his response to the touch and the following message?
- 2. What does his reaction tell us about the impact of encountering God's plans that are bigger than our own?
- 3. Daniel was praying over his concern for the apathy of God's people. How was God's answer different than what he may have expected?
 - a. Have you ever experienced God answering your prayers differently than you expected?
 - b. What can we learn about trusting God's bigger and better plans over our own expectations?
- 4. Why is it important to prioritize God's will over our own when we pray?
 - c. How can we adjust our prayer life to align more with seeking God's guidance?
- 5. What insight to the unseen battles do we see in verses 12-14? How does this insight affect your perseverance in prayer?

Read John 21:15-19

- 6. What parallels can we draw between Daniel's and Peter's experiences of humility and restoration?
- 7. How does society's view of brokenness differ from God's perspective?
- 8. Why and how does God often use our brokenness for His purposes?
 - d. How does Peter's story encourage you to accept forgiveness and move forward when you feel inadequate?

Read Daniel 10:18-21

- 9. Daniel is once again told that he is beloved as a response to his being "without strength". How is assurance of God's love the proper response to our feelings of weakness?
 - e. How can we build our confidence in the love of God?
 - f. How can we build the confidence in others that they are loved by God?
- 10. Who is the "Prince of Greece"? What is the "book of truth"?
- 11. Why is Michael described as "your prince"?
- 12. How is our faith encouraged knowing God has a plan for the future of His creation?
